

The notable equipment was the patient monitor which was installed at recovery area.



AREAS OF FUTURE SUPPORT

- a) The anaesthesia machines lack gas analysers for inhalation drugs and carbondioxed which are more important for practice.
- b) Central line insertion trainings
- c) Intravenous cannulation lights/ torch
- d) Extra monitors for recovery room
- e) Oxygen pressure gauges of above 20litres/ minute.

After a 2 week work at Mzuzu central, the team finally had to go around Mzuzu outskirts and have a safari visit before they left Malawi on 21st October 2022.




At the Safari
